



Howard Doering described a day at the Lyons' Air Museum in Santa Ana. It is on the west side of the John Wayne airport. \$8 donation to get in and a great set of WW2 aircraft on display.

It came out in discussion of the above that we need to make up flyers to leave at not only this museum, but the ones in Chino, March AF base, San Diego and Palm Springs. Tri-fold to $3 \frac{1}{2} \times 8 \frac{1}{2}$ would be good.

Discussion of getting a sanction for the Palmer Meet immediately. A date of April 27th and 28th was set. Warren Walker will set it up, but we need to establish the actual CD.

It was moved, seconded and passed to limit ourselves to 2 major contests a year. The Netzeband trophy will become a prize for the top performer at the Knights' Joust, similar to the perpetual trophy given out at the Palmer Memorial.

I want to congratulate our newly elected officers. I am sure they will do as good a job as the outgoing officers did this past year.

Our safety issue this month was prompted by an accident that occurred last month and should have been avoided. Fortunately, it did not cause a serious injury.

The accident occurred at Whittier Narrows to an excellent builder & flyer (Speed & Aerobatics), Jim Rhodes.

Jim was preparing to attend the GSSC and as he explained it to me, his helper was someone whom he had not worked with before. After starting his engine, there was a miscommunication between Jim and his pitman and the plane was not where it should have been. At that point Jim put his fingers into the spinning prop and naturally an injury was the result.

There are a number of points to consider in this example; first, no matter how experienced the modeler, accidents can happen if we get excited when we're about to take a flight; calm down; it's only a sport. Second; if using a new helper, do not assume he knows what you want; go over your plan with him (or her) before starting your engine.

Third, holding and launching a model airplane is a serious business that not everyone is capable of performing. If you have any doubts as to your assistant's capability; find someone you feel comfortable with, even if you have to wait until one is available.

Jim, I'm glad you did not suffer a serious injury & I apologize for any errors I may have made in relaying your incident.

Until next year, let's all make a conscientious effort to build & fly safely.
