

Larry Renger – He showed the horizontal tail surfaces of a Baby Clown that were hinged using strips of Polyspan. By the time the stab and elevator were covered with silkspan, the hinges disappear. They remain very flexible!



Andy Borgogna – RSM's new Naughty Girl. He built the prototype kit to prove out the design. He did modify it to use electric power (since flown, and very nice!). The motor is a Hacker A30-10XL, it swings a 12x6 prop @

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8500 rpm. Timer is a KR, and it uses a 4s, 3300mAh battery. Ready to fly, it is 51 ounces.

Bob Werle – He likes to shop, and found some lightweight ratcheting clamps at the Dollar Tree stores. Very nice! Also some small part containers at the 99c store. He showed a Fox .35 that he cleaned up in the Crock-pot. Finally, he showed a Stunt Wagon he scaled down from 60" span to 23". It has a profile fuselage and will be Black Widow powered.

Kevin Kusik - Carrier model he built in just 7 days. It was a Joe Just kit (I hope I got that right) that needed a LOT of work to make it useable. It is a Hellcat with a solid foam wing. Power is an Evo 36, a Smith carrier fuel tank. He took 2nd place with it at the Knights' Joust (36 profile carrier, 80 mph top speed, with AMA rules).



Howard Doering – Ryan STA over Route 1 in California as a painting his father did. Oil on canvas. Trust me, I know art, and this is VERY good! He won 1st place at the Orange County Fair with it. The airplane was the civilian version of the PT-20 with a 4 cylinder Menasco engine

Joe Brownlee – presented his experiences in learning how to



judge carrier by helping out at the Joust. One guy actually got disqualified for flying backwards (headwind faster than the plane, and he didn't compensate enough)

John Wright (again) – Super Tigre 46 in parts. He discussed how a major problem with old engines is having the rod stuck on the piston so that the rod rotates in the piston walls. This can cause trouble with the cylinder walls, and definitely wears out the seating holes in the piston. He showed a nifty tool that lets him grab the rod and work it loose while the piston is still in the crankcase.

Old Business

John reports that the Aviation Summer Camp thing seems dead. John, Andy and I went out to meet them at El Dorado park, and they never showed. So we flew anyway! One guy from the RC crew came over and was favorable of our efforts. No problem flying there in the future if we move away from the main flight/landing area. We were south, toward the trees.
